LIFELINE THE

History and Function—St. Louis Central Service Office by Carl B.

"Both A.A. and the Central Service Office have a long and

proud tradition in St. Louis. The first recorded A.A. meeting was held at the Forest Park Hotel on June 23, 1940 (a Sunday). There were five people present. Almost five years later to the day, on June 22, 1945 (a Friday) the Articles of Incorporation were registered with the City of St Louis for the Alano Society of St Louis MO Inc., and the Central Service Office opened its doors at the Commerce Bank Building downtown. Later the office was moved to the Boatman's Bank Building at 4505 Olive. And ultimately, in 1964 the Central Service Office moved to the location at 2683 Big Bend Boulevard.*

"The term 'Alano Society' refers to the Not-For-Profit Corporation which oversees the operation of the Central Service Office of the Greater St. Louis area. The term 'Alano Board' refers to the elected board that oversees that corporation. The Alano Society, the Alano Board, and the Intergroup Representatives of the Greater St. Louis area are bound by the Articles of Acceptance of the corporation and the written By-laws for the corporation. These basic written procedures were formulated to define the mission of the Central Service Office and the duties, responsibilities, and qualifications of the Alano Board Members and the Intergroup Representatives.

"As written in the By-Laws, the mission (purpose) of the Alano Society and thus the Central Service Office, is 'to provide education, spiritual help and training, social activity, and such other assistance as may be lawfully provided for those in St. Louis, St. Louis County, and adjoining counties, who suffer from alcoholism or uncontrolled drinking and to otherwise promote the physical, intellectual, social and spiritual welfare of alcoholics, in accordance with the program of Alcoholics Anonymous.'" ...

KEEPING MY GROUP INFORMED

Unfortunately, there is a lot of confusion when it comes to registering a group in A.A. - especially in St. Louis. Most groups want to register with the Central Service Office so their group will be listed on the Central Service Website, which also provides the local meeting listings for the Meeting Guide App. A lot of groups also want to register their groups with the General Service Office (GSO) of A.A. in New York. There are definite advantages to registering your group with both.

Back in 1944 when the St. Louis Central Office first began, groups in the Greater St. Louis Metropolitan Area were assigned numbers. However, the groups in rural Missouri created their own meeting lists and used group names instead of group numbers. Later some groups in St. Louis decided to list themselves with both a number and a name. The important point is that when contributing to the St. Louis Central Office each group contribution should be identified with the number and/or name of the group, so the group is credited with its contribution. Registering with the Central Office is easy. Have a group representative call Central Services at (314) 647-3677). To sign up to receive the Central Office Newsletter by email, go to the website at aastl.org, scroll to the bottom of the page and fill out the information in "Join Our Newsletter."

To register your group with the General Service Office (GSO) of A.A. in New York, contact the area registrar at registrar@eamo.org. When a group is registered with GSO they will receive a group ID number, which is not the same as numbers assigned by the St. Louis Central Service Office. Each assigned GSO number is nine digits. It is important for groups to use their number assigned by GSO when making contributions directly to GSO, so their group is credited with their contribution. Also, if making group contributions to GSO at the Central Service Office it is also important to use the group's nine-digit GSO number. The advantage of registering with GSO is that each group representative or mail contact will receive A.A.'s newsletter, Box 459, with the latest news of any changes in A.A., new literature available, and national A.A. events such as workshops and conventions. If you would like to sign up individually for A.A.'s newsletters, go to their website at aa.org/newsletters and you can read and/or sign up to receive their newsletters by email.
