#### THE FOUR G's

"Soon after I arrived in A.A. in 1979, someone handed me the book *Living Sober*. In that book I discovered the abbreviation H.A.L.T. Don't get too Hungry, too Angry, too Lonely, or too Tired. I hung on to that idea but I wanted a little something more, so I came up with my own 'One Day at a Time' program which I call my 'Four G's.' I will share it with you.

- **"1. GUTS**—My first 'G' I call Guts. Just plain Guts not to take the first drink today. Guts to change my playmates, playgrounds, and playthings. Guts to suffer pain because it's not painless to get sober. However, I found it's less painful to stay sober than to try to get sober again. Guts to get a good sponsor. Guts to attend meetings. Guts to work the steps. And a lot of extra Guts to become willing to change.
- **"2. GROUP**—My second 'G' I call Group. Lucky for me, it was necessary from the beginning to find a Home Group where I was comfortable and could get involved. Involvement then became a solution in staying sober one day at a time. It was necessary for me to arrive at my Group well before meeting time to help make coffee, put out literature, arrange chairs, and greet newcomers. It was also necessary to stay after the meeting and help with emptying ashtrays, housecleaning and talking to anyone who was hanging around. Eventually, I was privileged to become a trusted servant of my Group, for which I will always be grateful.
- **"3. GOD**—The third 'G' I call God. In the beginning I tried to hold on to my father & grandfather's God. It was the God of their understanding, but I did not understand it. My sponsor and my group, which I used as my God, I do understand. I don't have a photograph, recording, or written note, but my God is very real. He is a kind, merciful, loving and forgiving God. I found him right here in Alcoholics Anonymous. This is the God who gave me the gift of life, and what I do with my life as a sober alcoholic, is my gift back to God.
- "4. GRATITUDE—The fourth 'G' I call Gratitude. It is my hope that I never fail to be Grateful for the many things that have been given to me. I am Grateful for the past, for without it, the present would be meaningless. I am Grateful for a kind and loving sponsor who spent untold hours with me. I am Grateful for the return of my health, Grateful for the ability to love myself and the ability to receive and to give love without conditions. I am Grateful to be able to give without thoughts of receiving, Grateful for the experience of sharing with other alcoholics, I am so Grateful that you were there and the doors of A.A. were open when I came to you. I am Grateful for the newcomers, I don't know where I would be today without them.

Grateful for the Guts! Grateful for the Group! Grateful for God! Grateful for Gratitude!

Our group decided that in addition to newcomer packets, we wanted to offer packets to those visiting our group who are going into the healthcare professions, or other professions, seeking information on Alcoholics Anonymous. We feel it is important that they receive accurate and up-to-date information on A.A., directions to valid A.A. websites, and the phone number of our local central office or answering service. Unfortunately, there is a lot of misinformation about Alcoholics Anonymous on all forms of media, and it is important that we offer information that is accurate, concise, and to the point.

Through the years, A.A. World Services has developed many pamphlets which have been helpful to those who are alcoholic and non-alcoholic seeking information on Alcoholics Anonymous. 


