



When I finally decided to start going to meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous, I was somewhat skeptical about the people I would encounter. Would they be neurotic down-and-outers, etc.? Nothing could have been further from what I found! In my home group, there were everyday people—a mix of young and old from diverse walks of life, creeds and race-and seemingly happy! Everyone showed kindness and tolerance towards me. They let me know we were all there for the same reason-alcoholism! In Chapter 2, "There Is a Solution," the A.A. Big Book states: "... there exists among us a fellowship, a friendliness, and an understanding which is indescribably wonderful." This was true in every group I attended.

There was one woman in particular who stood out to me because of her dependability for "showing up" at our home group meetings. She led a peaceful, joyful life in spite of many health challenges. When she passed away, I came into possession of some of her A.A. books and memorabilia. This included a thermos mug with the slogan: "Stay On The Path." Since I used to meet her on a prayer path near our homes, I thought how appropriate this message was as we trudged "... the road to happy destiny." Just stay on the A.A. path! I thank my Higher Power for all the people I have met in A.A. "who normally would not mix."
