





# A Matter of Perspective

I have noticed over the years that my perspective can easily become distorted, especially when my ego is involved. It's like I am looking through both ends of a pair of binoculars. When I look at others, their character defects seem up close and huge, but when I look at my own character defects, it's as if I turn the binoculars around and look through the wrong end and my character defects seem far away and small. However, my ego can turn on me causing the opposite distortion with my character defects becoming huge and the character defects of others seem small by comparison. It has only been through working the Twelve Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous that I have been able to attain a proper perspective of both myself and others. I often have to tell myself to put down the binoculars!

# **Forms of Public Information**

- Signs outside A.A. meeting places
- Distribution of A.A. literature
- A.A. websites
- Anonymity protected Public Service Announcements, informational videos, radio, TV, digital media

# **General Principles**

- Radio, TV, Film, Internet: A.A. members refrain from showing their faces & use of last names.
- Printed Articles, Websites, E-mail: A.A. members identify by first names & last initials only.
- Post, Text, or Blog: A.A. members assume they are publishing at public level.

# A.A. Websites

- A.A. members observe all A.A. principles & traditions.

# **Social Networking Websites**

- Public in nature—A.A.s do not identify as A.A. members.

#### E-mail

- Consider anonymity of all recipients.

#### Internet

- A.A. members carefully consider situations where anonymity could be compromised at public level.

# Videos & Audios

- Public Service Announcements help to carry the message of recovery & inform public and professionals about A.A.

"Except for the talk given in Detroit in 1948, Dr. Bob was noted for speaking very briefly. Both he and Anne were often quoted as having said, 'If you speak more than 15 minutes, you're going to repeat yourself,' or 'No souls are saved after 15 minutes.'

"One story had it that when Dr. Bob was guest speaker at an out-of-town meeting, he got up and said that the world's finest talks had been short ones. For example, both the Sermon on the Mount and the Gettysburg Address had been given in less than five minutes. 'With this point in mind,' he said, 'I also propose to give a short talk. In fact, I just did.'
