Area-level (St. Louis Metro area)

At least six different nursing homes and senior living facilities have requested an A.A. presence in their facility. Our activity there may range from Public Information sessions, to one-on-one visits, to regular A.A. meetings in the facility.

Individuals are needed to do Public Information talks and one-on-one meetings; groups can bring a meeting to a facility that has enough interested people to make up a meeting.

District 17 (Jefferson County)

Outreach to first responders, hospital emergency rooms, etc.

Individuals are needed to visit the various professionals, explain how A.A. can help, and how the professionals may contact us locally.

District 42 – Public Information

First meeting with District 42 and sober advertising professional was held. We're looking at various ways to be effective within the budget available.

St. Louis County Women's Jail
