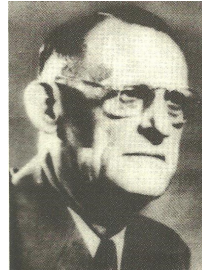


"The Man on the Bed." This oil painting was created by Robert M. for the AA Grapevine and was reproduced as the center spread in the December 1955 issue.

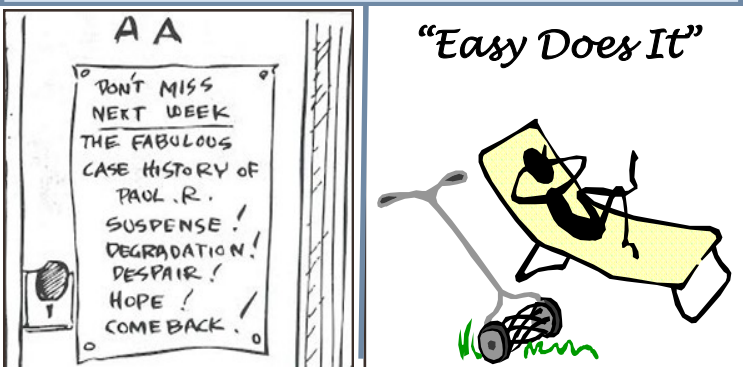
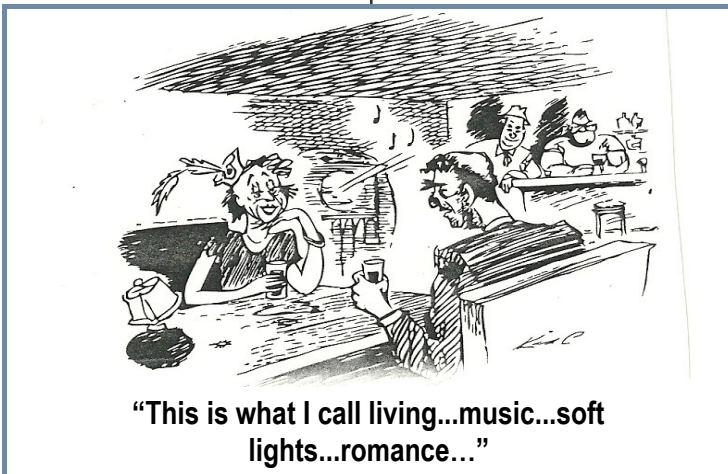

“IT USED TO BE...”

- A dollar in the basket was enough.
- When a sponsor got a new sponsee, they brought them by the Central Service Office and explained its purpose.
- The newsletter had more younger birthdays than older ones.
- We got people involved in service work right from the start.
- The Alano Banquet drew 2,000 people.
- Meetings cleaned up after themselves.
- We spent more in tips in one night than what we now put in the basket to support A.A.
- Sponsees were doing service work before they knew what service work was.
- The only thing discussed around the tables was alcohol.
- You couldn't see who was speaking through all the cigarette smoke in the room.
- A sponsor would take their sponsee to the Area Assembly to show them what keeps A.A. running.
- Cleaning ash trays was part of service work.
- You had to climb two flights of stairs to get to the Central Service Office.
- You always carried a current *Where & When*.
- Almost every meeting had Greeters.
- There were three A.A. dances a month in St Louis.”
